SUBJECT: Fatal Traffic Collision Involving Two Vehicles and an eBike

On February 22, 2026 at approximately 6:23 p.m., officers from the Oxnard Police Department responded with Emergency Medical Services to an injury traffic collision involving two vehicles and an eBike near the intersection of Saviers Road and Guava Street. Officers arrived and discovered a 40-year-old male lying in the southbound lanes of Saviers Road. The subject was pronounced deceased on scene by Emergency Medical Services. A 1999 Ford F-250 was parked along the right shoulder of Saviers Road, south of the intersection. The driver of that vehicle, a 67-year-old male resident of Oxnard was contacted on scene. He remained on scene and cooperated with the investigation.

Based on the initial investigation, officers believe the Ford pick-up was traveling southbound Saviers Road in lane number three. The bicyclist was traveling northbound Saviers Road in lane number three. The Ford pick-up collided head-on with the bicyclist, just north of Guava Street. The bicyclist was ejected from his bike and landed in lane number two. According to a witness and evidence in the roadway, the bicyclist and his eBike were run over by a second southbound vehicle. The second vehicle, a Sport Utility Vehicle, continued southbound Saviers Road, dragging the eBike one block south of the original collision scene. The driver stopped, dislodged the eBike from their vehicle, and then fled the collision scene.

It did not appear speed or impairment by alcohol and/or drugs were contributing factors to the original this collision, however, the investigation is ongoing.
